First and Second Days of Rosh Hashanah **Tuesday, September 7, 2021 and Wednesday, September 8, 2021**

The tickets assumed we would be in the sanctuary. That's why they say we will start the service on both days of Rosh Hashanah at 8:30 am. That's our traditional start time for the High Holy Days. Instead, since we will be on Zoom, we will start on both days at 9:00 am.

We have worked hard to delete or shorten repetitious prayers and we have worked hard to complete the service in 3½ hours.

We have had Shabbat services on Zoom since March 2020, but we need your help to make it work.

If you have an Aliyah or have an English reading, make sure that you are signed into Zoom earlier than the time that you are scheduled to participate.

Jeff Haveson will look for all participants, and will communicate with them via the "chat" and through text messaging. The "chat" icon is on the bottom of the Zoom screen. Click on the "chat" icon and the chat list will pop up on the right of your screen, so you can see if Jeff is sending you a message. You can also "chat" with other members of the congregation.

We will note in the schedule below, when the Ark is traditionally opened or when we traditionally stand. It is customary to stand for the Shofar blasts. The schedule is for both days of Rosh Hashanah. The times are approximate.
